

ALF PYNER - ARTIST, PHOTOGRAPHER, TEACHER

Within our Society we have members who have played major rolls in photographic history. Alf Pyner of Bronte with 63 years experience in photography, is an expert in many things. After leaving the Royal Air Force at the close of WW II, he joined Ilford Limited where he began a long association with the company's experiments to develop colour materials. He eventually became a lecturer with the responsibility of enlightening the press, professional photographers and the public in the technical aspects of processing colour films and papers.

Mr. Pyner will talk on "From Dufaycolour to Ilfochrome" making use of slides, prints and scripts he used in his educational seminars during the 1950-60 era. Says Alf, "Its going to be difficult to condense a week long seminar into a oneevening lecture, but I'm sure I can enlighten members on the

great changes in photography wrought from the many trials and tribulations we encountered at Ilford to produce viable colour products."



It's wise to pay attention to advertisements in our E-Mail and PHSC News Sheet as the above photo proves. Ron Anger (right) was instrumental in guiding a Mrs. Baker to place an ad in our November E-Mail. Larry Boccioletti visited the lady and was offered a swath of old processing trays and printing frames which he showed little interest in. Then Mrs. Baker pushed forth a cardboard box from which came this immaculate 5x7 Long Focus Premo camera made by Rochester Optical in the late 1890s. Larry immediately made the purchase. The camera sat in a closet for about 70 years, according to Mrs. Baker, and had been purchased by her great grandfather who quit taking pictures in the 1920s. It comes complete with a certificate dated November 8, 1899 attesting to the quality of its lens.








Toronto Notes...

Our February enabled meetina members to gain a closer view of highlights from the impressive Walter Shean Collection as auction cataloguers described a few favorite items running the gamut from high ticket to medium priced and from the smallest to the largest.

The general advice was that with the reasonable estimates in the catalogue there are bargains available to all level of buyers. From the 552 lots Bill Kantymir displayed large box cameras to sub-miniatures - all prized collector items. Gerry Loban featured several 35mm cameras of interest which are quite affordable. Bob Carter discussed the high ticket Goerz Hypergon wide angle 9 cm lens estimated at \$1400. Bob Wilson said books and paper photographica have received special attention. To handle the 552 lots the auction has been split into two parts with successive closing dates of April 29 and April 30.

FROM THE 'NET

The BJP Digital News (bjp.webmaster@biphoto.co.uk) reports that Hasselblad has been bought by its Asian distributor – the Shriro Group, thus putting an end to uncertainty over Hasselblad's future.

Japan's Konica Corp. and Minolta Co., two film photography giants struggling for a foothold in the digital era, have agreed to a merger that could propel them into the big league of office machine makers.

Canon has confirmed that it has ceased production of its D60 digital camera less than a year after the model's introduction, and Leica announced that it will no longer manufacture its M6 TTL 35mm camera, after 18 years of service. News of the D60 followed a leak by Canon in Canada.

Three years after announcing its hexagonal-geometry innovative Super-CCD, Fujifilm has unveiled a further development claiming superior image quality through an extended dynamic range. The fourth generation Super-CCD is launched in advance of the arrival of cameras bearing the technology. There will be two cameras, both high-end compacts, featuring two different sensors; one will prioritise higher resolution (up to 13 million output pixels) and the other will offer up to 6.7 million pixels with an extended dynamic range.

A new collaboration between Noritsu and Seiko Epson introduces the dDP-411 Digital Dry Printer using piezo inkjet technology and comprises an input and output device taking up no more than 1 meter square. The device is manufactured and marketed by Noritsu, with Seiko Epson providing long-life Micro Piezo inkjet print heads that are said to last up to five years.

Konica's new high-speed film scanner - the RX-3 is three times faster than its predecessor, the RX-2, offering a scan time of just two seconds per frame, advanced batch scanning and five selectable resolution modes up to 2200dpi.
