

## Wednesday, January 15th Meeting...



George Hunter of Mississauga, Ont., is our guest speaker for this first program of the year 2003. Be sure to attend this coming Wednesday night at the North York Central Library (basement). We've finally nailed him down as a speaker since he is usually flitting across Canada or to parts of the world to add to his stock of travel photography or to service corporate clients.

George has spent some 60 years in professional photography and can relate many interesting anecdotes of his escapades and close calls in shooting illustrations throughout the world. A specialist in aerial photography, many of his pictures have become calendar art or used in government travel booths to promote the beauties of Canada. If you visited any of the Canadian pavilions at Expo 67, or carried \$5 or \$10 bills in your pocket in the 1970s, then you have seen some of George's photo illustrations. We've encouraged him to bring one or two of his aerial cameras which have been custom converted to his personal needs.

Mr. Hunter was honoured with the Lifetime Achievement Award by CAPIC, Canada's leading association of photographers and illustrators. He recently organized the Canadian Photography Heritage Foundation to recover, restore and preserve electronically the best images from lifetime collections of aging and recently deceased photographers. Each photographer will be limited to a maximum of 100 of their best photographs. Being the prime supporter of the project, Mr. Hunter has shouldered the main workload to get the foundation up and running. Through a well publicized web site these images will be available for the whole world to view.




Our December meeting featured our annual Christmas gift exchange and then the latest of the very popular "Show and Tell" sessions. These shows demonstrate the wide ranging interests of our members.



Everett Roseborough. Our Editor Emeritus showed a number of c1930s print processing envelopes from local processors (H.C. Tugwell, Leggett's, Tamblyn, etc.). Bill Kantymir. Our President had a single item to show, but it was exceptional - an 1899 Pocket Kozy Camera. This attractive item turned up at our recent fall fair. Three versions were manufactured of which only examples of versions two and three are known to have survived. Bill's camera is a version three. The cameras were sold factory direct for initially \$10 and later \$6. Loading the camera was overly complex which may have led to its short life in the marketplace.

Larry Boccioletti. Our Fall Fair Chairman showed the homemade projector that was part of his "50 Years of Collecting" talk a year ago last September. The device uses a sewing machine motor to run the cooling fan and famous Leeuwenhoek singlelens microscope -a model made by Gerald Cranham of Parksville BC.

Mark Singer. The Spring Fair Chairman offered two Bolex movie cameras of remarkably similar design. Mark noted that Bolex was a high end maker of 16mm movie cameras in the mid 1900s. When the 8mm cameras began eating into its market, Bolex responded by offering an 8mm version of its camera (1956-65).

Mike Robinson. Our Vice President is a pre-eminent modern-day daguerreotypist. His show and tell consisted of four daguerreotype images. The first two were 1840s French images in the European style (uncased but glass covered and matted). antique store. Opening a box he spotted a lens board with two lenses mounted side by side. More investigation brought forth a convertible Century Stereo camera made after 1900.

#### **Publication & Research Awards Submissions**

Once again the PHSC Grants Committee reminds members that awards are available to encourage and bring forward original research or publication of Canadian photographic history.

A \$500 research grant is offered annually to a current PHSC member. An outline proposal (maximum 1 page) should indicate the topic, reason for choice, usefulness of the material, intended research sources & techniques, previous experience, expected output and schedule.

A grant of up to \$1000 is available to a current PHSC member to aid in the publication, in book or monograph form, of original research into Canada's photographic history. A one page written proposal should outline topic, format, print run, cost and timing, and should be accompanied with a copy of the material (if available) and a sample of any previous published work. The submission will be judged on the criteria of extent to which the material expands existing knowledge or facilitates application of existing knowledge and its revelence to Canada. Grants are not necessarily awarded each year but more than one may be made each year.
